ABOUT US

Rev. Brother Paul Sun Education Foundation (the 'Foundation') is a charitable trust body approved by the Hong Kong Government as a tax-exempt charitable organisation. The trust document establishing the Foundation sets out the objective, operation, governance and other provisions. The main aim of the Foundation is to promote education, as a continuation of the significant work accomplished by our beloved late Rev. Bro. Paul Sun, founder of St. Joseph's Anglo-Chinese School (SJACS) and St. Joseph's Anglo-Chinese Primary School (SJACPS)

Rev. Bro Paul Sun (20 November 1907 – 13 March 1986) lived a life of Catholic faith, hope, and love. He dedicated his life to educating the young. In 1958, with the support of the De La Salle Brothers, the Marist Brothers, and others, he established SJACS and SJACPS in a small old villa, starting with 455 boys. Before returning to The Lord, he learned that his beloved villa would be redeveloped into a modern primary school and a parish church. He won the admiration and respect of his peers. He put SJACS and SJACPS under the special patronage of St. Joseph, and instilled in us, his boys, the St. Joseph Family Spirit.

The Foundation is named in memory and in honour of this great man.

SJACPS new e-education initiatives

We have successfully completed the second fund raising target HK\$301K for SJACPS, in support of its new e-education initiatives.

University Scholarship Program

I am happy to announce two more new scholarships were set up for SJACS DSE graduates. We now in total have eleven scholarships for SJACS graduates entering into Universities of different disciplines.

A Roll of Honors is expected to be put up in the Rev. Bro. Paul Sun Memorial Hall that will display, for all to see, the names of the various scholars and the awards won. The aim is to instill a sense of pride in academic achievement and to encourage students to emulate such fine examples – true to the school motto: Ad Astra!

Non-Academic and Financial Assistance

We also set up Scholarship for Non-Academic and Financial Assistance Scheme to diversify our scope and help students of different needs and potentials.

Free EyeGlass Services for Needy Students

Eyeland Co. offers free eyeglass services for needy students from the schools under Foundation's sponsorship.

Reaching Out Further Afield

Guided by the ideals of the late Rev. Brother Paul Sun, the Board of Trustees is following a policy to extend the coverage of the Foundation's work to more schools in need. Price Memorial Catholic Primary School, St. John the Baptist Catholic Primary School (Kwun Tong), and Bishop Ford Memorial School are new beneficiaries of the Foundation

New Fund Raising Initiatives

2015-2016 is another busy and challenging year for the Foundation. Among our plans, we are launching a new series of Speakers' Forums. The first one was held on October 6, 2015. HK\$301K DONATION TO SJACPS FOR E-LEARNING

In August of last year, the Foundation fulfilled its pledge to donate HK\$301,000 to St Joseph's Anglo-Chinese Primary School (SJACPS) to support their e-learning initiatives. Our donations have now come to fruition with the introduction of eClass hardware and software at the school.

SIACPS has introduced many new digital aids with our support, including:

- PowerLesson: Teachers are now able to formulate and deliver interactive, digital lesson plans.
- PowerBoard: Classrooms have been fitted with a digital whiteboard that allows students and teachers to interact with notes and objects on the board.
- eClass app for parents and teachers: The app has greatly enhanced communication between parents and teachers.
- Smart card attendance taking: Students now have smart student cards. Their attendance can be recorded by tapping the card on the card readers on the playground when they arrive at school.

• Digitizing the library and introducing eBooks: The school has upgraded its library database from using an analog, paper-based system, to using a digital database, making it easier to keep track of books. The school has also introduced a wide range of eBooks.

BRO PAUL SUN YOUNG SCHOLAR AWARD

The Bro. Paul Sun Young Scholar Award is a \$10,000 scholarship offered to outstanding, newly-graduated students of our beneficiary primary schools who are promoted to St. Joseph's Anglo-Chinese School, the school founded by our late namesake.

This year there were 2 awardees:

- Mr. Ku Chi Kit from St. Joseph's Anglo-Chinese Primary School
- Mr. Ng Lok Hei from Kowloon Bay St. John the Baptist Catholic Primary School

SJACS SCHOLARSHIPS

On Thursday, 24th September 2015, St. Joseph's Anglo-Chinese School (SJACS) held a scholarship award ceremony for the academic year 2014/2015. Trustees Roger Lam and Daniel Li present to hand out awards sponsored by the Foundation.

First, there was the Best Student Award, given to the student with achieved the best academic results during the year. This time, the honor of dux of school went to Master Lo Jun Yin. A certificate with a cheque of \$2,000 was handed out by Roger Lam, amid thunderous applause from fellow students.

Mr. Lam went on to give out the second category of awards, to honor students in each form for good conduct. This time, there were 4 winners from each of F.1 to 4 and five students from F.5. They shared a total of \$5,000.

Next, Trustee Daniel Li was called upon to hand out the third category of awards. This is a new category added by the Foundation at the special request of a donor. The donor's wish is to take care of students with good conduct and diligence but have financial needs. With the help of the teachers, deserving students in each Form had been selected to receive this honor and share a pool of almost \$20,000.



COMMENDABLE CONDUCT AWARDS FOR SJACS STUDENTS

With the support of an anonymous donor, a HK\$100,000 fund has been set up for Commendable Performance in Conduct Awards for current students of St. Joseph's Anglo-Chinese School. The school nominates students for this award. To be considered, students must have outstanding conduct, excellent academic performance, and be in financial need. Around 9 awards are expected to be given out this year.

UNIVERSITY SCHOLARSHIP PROGRAM

Among the very first projects initiated by the Rev. Brother Paul Sun Education Foundation is a University Scholarship Program for students of St. Joseph's Anglo-Chinese School, founded by the late Rev. Brother Paul Sun. In line with the Foundation's objective to encourage academic excellence, this program is designed to reward young Josephians who are able to achieve good results enabling them to secure enrollment in a university to pursue certain disciplines. Each award is HK\$10,000 in cash.

Applications are open to graduating students. Each applicant is required to submit a short essay introducing himself and describing how he would help the Foundation in future, and supported by letters of recommendation from teachers. Candidates are then selected for interview by a panel of judges constituted of two trustees and one donor. Since its introduction in the academic year 2011-12, nine awards have been given out.




